Anne- Emmanuelle Deysin now lives in Paris and spends several weeks a year in the US. She received her Juris Doctor from the Paris II Law School and her PhD from the University of Paris. She also has a Masters' of American Studies and is a graduate of Paris Institut d'Etudes Politiques.

She is a tenured Professor at Paris Ouest Nanterre University, where she created in 1994 and is now Directing a Master' s Programme of International Business and Cross cultural Negotiation. She has taught in various European and US institutions and also co-directs a summer programme of Comparative law that she created in 2005 with GGU Law School in San Francisco, which is ABA accredited. She was Vice President for International Relations at Paris X from 1998 to 2003 and has now been President of the US/French consortium of academic cooperation, Micefa since 2002.

She is also a consultant in international business (with an emphasis on the USA) and trains business executives in cross cultural negotiation. She works with NDI (an NGO in Washington DC) on a regular basis (Nigeria & Sierra Leone recently, Ivory Coast in December 2013). She is a regular guest on various French radios and Televisions, such as Europe 1, RFI, LCI (24 hour French network), France 5, LCP (equivalent of C-Span), France 24 (in French & English).

She has written extensively on comparative political and legal systems, lobbying in the US and the EU and Strategies of Influence.

Among her publications:

The Justice System in the United State, Doing business in the US, two books are about the US political system. She has a forthcomingbook about the Supreme Court, called "The Supreme Court and Democracy" to be published by Dalloz (2014).
